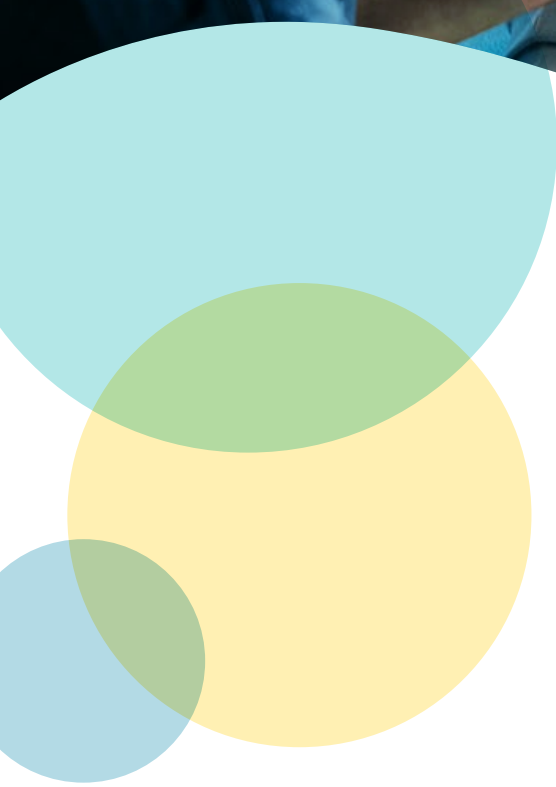

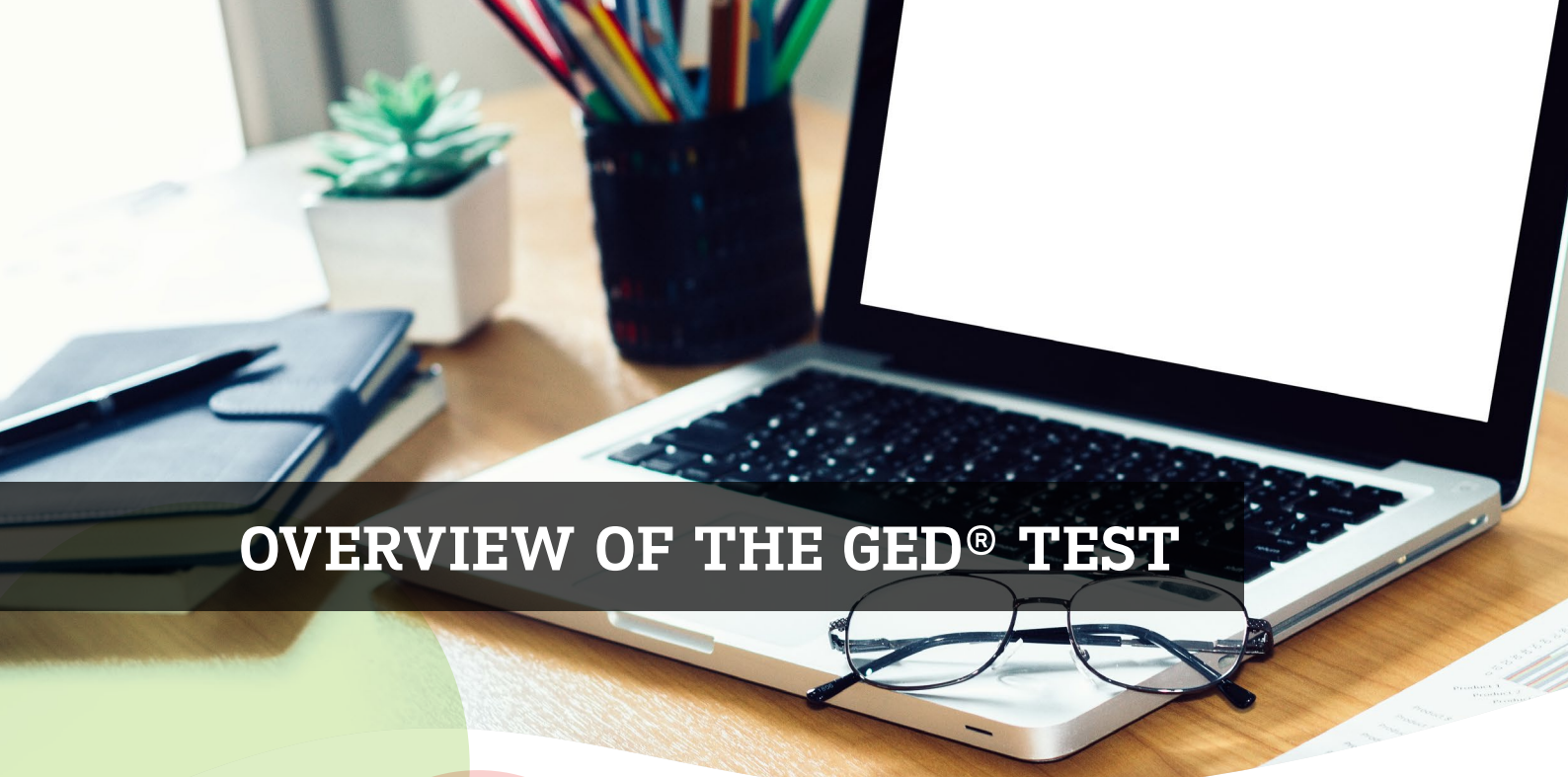

OVERVIEW OF THE GED® TEST

Why Should I Take The GED® Test?

Want to achieve the U.S. high school equivalency credential? Demonstrate mastery of English language skills and obtain the opportunity to enter university in countries around the world. It's not too late. Taking your GED® test is the first step towards building the future you imagine.

When you think about your future, what does it look like? University? A better job? Making more money?

Don't just dream it. Do it.

Eligibility

- » You can take the GED® test if you are at least 16 years old.*
- » The test is offered in American English only.

Cost

The GED® tests cost USD \$80 per subject in International markets. The total cost of all four subjects is USD \$320





WHAT'S ON THE TEST?

The GED® test is made up of 4 test subjects. You can take them one at a time or up to all four at once.



Reasoning Through Language Arts

- » 150 minutes (including a 10 minute break)
- » Includes one essay that you have 45 minutes to write

Measures your ability to:

- » read closely, write clearly, and edit and understand written text
- » understand, interpret, and answer questions based on text
- » use evidence to support an argument
- » demonstrate American English skills at a level needed to succeed in university or work



Mathematical Reasoning

- » 115 minutes
- » 2 parts with no break
- » No calculator allowed on the first part
- » TI-30XS on-screen calculator available for the remaining questions
- » Math formulas and a calculator reference guide provided

Subject Breakdown:

- » Algebraic reasoning 55%
- » Quantitative reasoning 45%

Science

- » 90 minutes
- » No break
- » TI-30XS on-screen calculator available for some questions

Measures your:

- » Ability to read, understand, and interpret science-related texts
- » Problem-solving abilities in science-related situations

Subject breakdown:

- » Earth and Science 20%
- » Physical Science 40%
- » Life Science 40%



Social Studies

- » 70 minutes
- » No break
- » TI-30XS on-screen calculator available for some questions

Measures your:

- » Ability to read, understand, and interpret social studies-related texts
- » Problem-solving abilities in social studies-related situation

Subject breakdown:

- » Economics 15%
- » Geography and the World 15%
- » US History 20%
- » Civics and Government 50%

The best way to find out if you're ready for the GED® test is to take the GED Ready® practice test

Once you take the GED Ready® practice test, you'll get your Enhanced Score Report. It predicts your likelihood of passing and gives you a personalized study plan to pass or score higher. Working with a teacher? Share your score report with your teacher to get targeted help in areas you want to improve.

Once the practice test tells you that you're ready, you should schedule and take that GED® test subject as soon as possible.

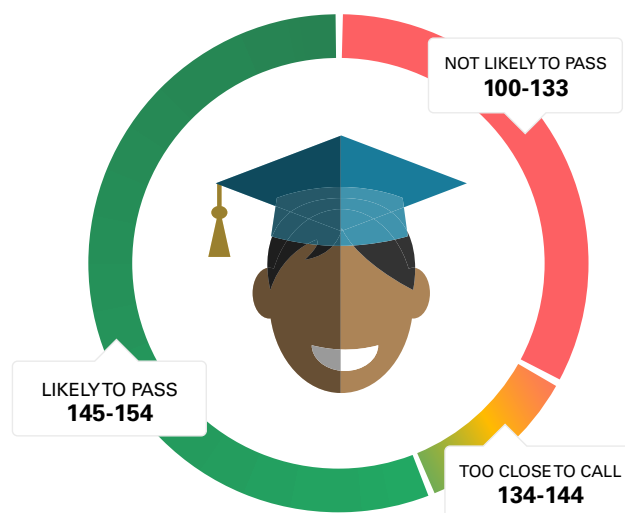
When can I expect my scores?

GED Ready® practice test scores will be ready as soon as you finish the test.

GED® test scores are usually ready in 3 hours or less. Sometimes it can take a few days. You'll get an email letting you know when your scores are ready.

What if I don't pass?

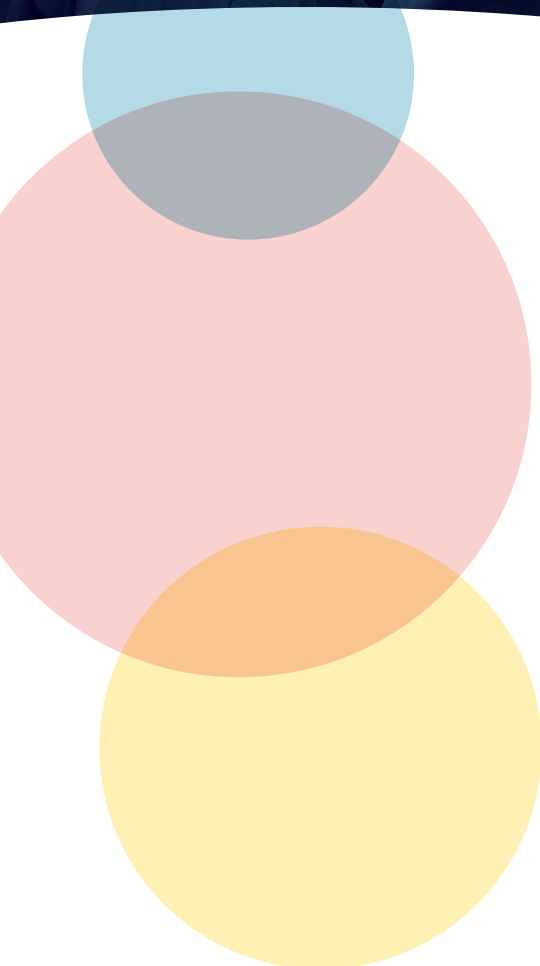
It happens. But don't worry – here's what you need to know about retaking your test:

- » You can retake the test right away.
- » Use your personal study plan from your Enhanced Score Report to study before you try again. Once you're ready to try again, schedule your retake in your MyGED® account.
- » After you take a subject 3 times, you have to wait 60 days before retesting.

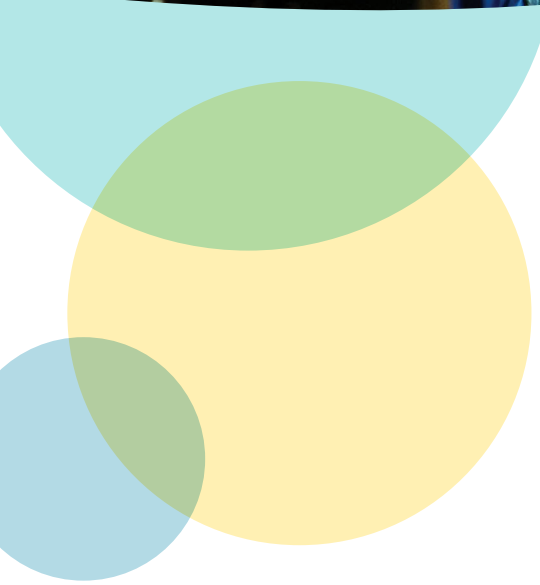
How do I get my transcript and diploma?

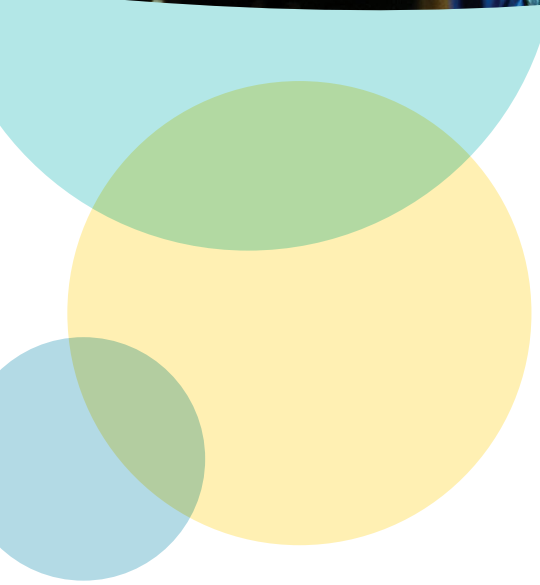
