National Data – GED Testing in Correctional Facilities

Facts	2020	2021	2022	2023
Test-takers	34,931	37,721	48,496	54,969
Completers	18,729	20,850	28,779	33,691
Passers	12,754	14,285	19,409	22,715
Pass rates	68%	69%	67%	67%

For context, median age of noncorrectional GED testers is 21.

Highest Grade Completed:

- 9% finished some of the 12th grade (23% non-correctional testers)
- 24% finished the 11th grade
- 27% finished the 10th grade
- 17% finished the 9th grade
- 11% finished less than 9th (8% noncorrectional testers)



GED Passing Score

To pass the GED test, students need a score of 145 on all four subjects.

165 - 174



GED College Ready

At 165 or higher, students may qualify to bypass placement testing and remedial (non-credit) courses in college.

175 – 200 **1**



GED College Ready + Credit

At 175 or higher, students may qualify for up to 10 college credit hours at participating colleges.





New Educator Checklist

if you are new to teaching the GED test, here's a checklist to help you get started.

- First, familiarize yourself with some of the basics of the test and make sure you are receiving our latest updates.
 - Sign up for our monthly newsletter, In Session, to get test updates, helpful resources and program news.
 - Look through our student study guides. These provide an overview of the skills being tested and include sample problems for each skill.
- Once you know the basics, now it is time to better understand the student experience in GED.com.
 - Feel free to create your own account in GED.com so you understand what your students will go through (please list your last name as "Candidate" so we know you are an instructor).
 - Take the free practice test so you understand the format of the test and the different types of questions.
 - Finally, consider taking a <u>GED Ready</u> test, the official GED practice test. This is half the length of the GED test and is highly predictive of how students will perform on the actual test.
 - Make sure you review your detailed score report. This is the report that tells students the areas they need to work on to score higher on the test.
 - Notice that they can select their study materials from the dropdown box to create a customized study plan.
- After becoming familiar with the student journey, it's time to apply for GED.
 <u>Manager</u>, a free tool designed for adult educators where you can see your students' scores and score reports.
 - Apply for access via the Educators section of GED.com. Each state has different rules on who can gain access.
 - Once you get access, watch our training on how to effectively use the tool.

GED Ready Delivery

- GED Ready in correctional facilities is delivered in the same manner you deliver the GED test.
- Delivered via the Pearson VUE software installed on your administrator computer and computers used for student testing
- GED Ready can also be delivered in a different manner called "GED Ready Offline" delivery method.
- No internet access needed to take the test.
- No Test Center scheduling required.



Problems to Solve



- GED Ready voucher code spreadsheets are an administrative headache.
 - Difficult to distribute to educators
 - Difficult to maintain
 - Difficult to share codes with students (via email)
- Expiring vouchers compound the headache.
- Everyone spends too much time dealing with voucher codes.





Solution – GED Ready Direct


New feature in GED Manager allowing educators to purchase GED Ready tests and assign them directly to students.

- No expiration dates to extend







GED Direct

- Purchasing GED Readys via GED Direct will result in correctional facilities receiving bulk pricing and considerable savings off the retail price.
- Purchasing GED tests via GED Direct is not advised for most correctional facilities as the price is what the public pays and not the correctional pricing, i.e. correctional facilities do not pay/receive channel compensation thus the price per subject is \$10.00 lower for corrections (\$26 vs \$36 for states with standard pricing).





GED Test Delivery

CCT and Chromebooks





Software Installation: Cloud Computing Technology (CCT) is available for Correctional Facilities

cct software delivers the GED test with some advantages over the standard software install.

- CCT software install is **faster to install** than the standard software.
- CCT **functions as a server** in large testing centers with 15 or more computers.
- Software updates are handled via the cloud (not manually).
- Requires internet connectivity that is stable and reliable.
- You must be a **GED Only** center in order to go the CCT route.





Standard Software vs CCT (Cloud)

Standard Software

- Allows test delivery in an offline manner, i.e. student is testing on a computer, but the computer does not need to be internet connected.
- The test administrator computer will need to connect to the internet on test day in order to download/upload the exams.
- Once the software is installed there are periodic software updates you will need to run over time in order to keep the software up to date and secure.

Cloud Computing Technology (CCT)

CCT software delivers the GED test with some advantages over the standard software install.

- CCT software install is faster to install than the standard software
- CCT eliminates the need for a server in large testing centers with 15 or more computers. CCT functions as the server.
- No periodic software updates for you as the test center to do. Software updates are handled via the cloud.
- · Requires internet connectivity that is stable and reliable





CCT Delivery

- We are delivering the GED test via the CCT software at 50-60 GED testing sites across the U.S.
- There are correctional facilities in 7-8 states delivering via CCT.
- Feedback from test administrators regarding test delivery via CCT has been positive.
- If you are aware of correctional facilities in your state experiencing consistent technical issues contact your GEDTS SRM to discuss a possible transitional to CCT.
- Remember, CCT requires internet connectivity that is stable and reliable





Delivering GED® Tests on Chromebooks in Correctional Facilities?







GED Test Delivery on Chromebooks

- Michigan DOC has delivered the first GED tests on Chromebooks in the past couple of months. This is a major milestone.
- There has been, and continues to be, a major effort by MI DOC staff to make this happen along with Pearson VUE IT staff.
- MI DOC is working to expand GED testing on Chromebooks throughout all of their facilities.
- Ohio Dept. of Rehabilitation and Corrections is also working toward delivery of the GED test on Chromebooks.





Delivering GED Testing on Chromebooks

- Please know that GED testing on Chromebooks is in a pilot phase.
- Think of GED testing on Chromebooks as a new product. A new product that has many technical challenges, bugs and product documentation is a work in progress.
- MI DOC staff have invested considerable time and effort to make this happen as are OH DOC staff.
- We need to proceed slowly with expanding, but we are open to conversations with additional correctional sites.
- Delivery on Chromebooks is for correctional facilities ONLY.

Reminder

 Please remind correctional staff that they must complete registering individuals in GED Manager before they will be able to schedule individuals for the GED test.

- Is there a need for materials/flyers focused on GED testing for corrections?
- For example, I've received feedback that a one page document highlighting how to become a GED testing center would be helpful for correctional facilities who don't currently deliver GED testing.





Correctional Verification List

Issue: correctional facilities have consistently expressed frustration with the difficulty in verifying whether an individual has passed the GED test in a state outside of the one they are currently incarcerated.

Ex. Ohio DOC has a new inmate who says he passed the GED test in Florida in 2012.

How GEDTS Can Help: we have compiled a correctional verification contact list by state to assist correctional facilities in verifying whether an individual in your facility passed the GED test in another state.




