# How Can GED Analytics Help You?

- On-demand access to GED testing data from 2014 on
- Allows you to instantly look at testing volume, pass rates, demographic information, and much, much more
- Filter GED test data by demographic information such as age, gender, whether they attended adult education, tested in a correctional facility and more
- Easily download reports as Excel files or graphics as image files

# Access to GED Analytics

- All GED Administrators have access
- GED Administrator approves access for others throughout the state that need access well.

There are 2 different roles.

- GED Analytics (aggregate data & student details)
- GED Analytics Lite (aggregate data only can be viewed)

# Data integrity

- Nightly upload of data
- Every data element is defined (drop down arrows above each number provide definitions)
- Data source: MyGED™ portal database which gets appointment details, and exam results from Pearson VUE
- At initial log-in, you will electronically sign an End User Licensing agreement, agreeing to protect any confidential information
