Most Recent GED Ready Practice Test Scores

After taking your practice test, if you're likely to pass then schedule your test right away. If not, read your score report and see exactly what skills you need to brush up on.

After studying, make sure you're prepared for the test by taking the GED Ready again.

What do my GED test scores mean?

Scoring 145 - 164 means that you passed the subject. Scoring 165 - 174 means that you are ready to take college-level courses in that subject. Scoring 175 - 200 means that you could qualify for college credit for that subject. Learn more >

What if I don't pass one or more of the GED test subjects?

If you did not pass one of your GED test subjects, you are given two subsequent retests, with no restrictions between retakes. If you fail the third or any subsequent retest, you must wait 60 days for your next attempt.



They can even cancel the appointment **AFTER** the exam has started.


DOCs and FBOPs that deliver <u>only</u> GED exams can reschedule/cancel exams after the appointment start time if the exam cannot be completed due to interruption, lockdown, or site closure.

NOTE: The outlined process needs to be done PRIOR to running the RMA.





What's New? Duplicate Accounts



Coming up: Duplicate Accounts Solution(s)

Two main reasons why students create duplicate accounts:



Students forget they have an account or forget their login information



Students are purposefully creating duplicate accounts to bypass retake rules or other requirements



Coming up: Duplicate Accounts Solutions

Solutions for Account Recovery

- Enhance the flow and messaging when a student tries to sign up with an existing email, and get them to Password Reset quickly
- Add a "Welcome Back" message on the login page if the system recognizes the machine (similar to Facebook/Google)
- 3. Add a "Forgot Account" or "Recover your email" flow (similar to bank and other sites) to recover their account



Coming up: Duplicate Accounts Solutions

Solution(s) for malicious account creations

- Implement duplicate account matching that stops students with multiple matching accounts to schedule a test until their accounts are reviewed/approved to continue
 - this happens during the scheduling flow, students with matching account criteria are put in an exception queue for review
- Add "Recover your duplicate account" self service student flow to allow students to merge their own accounts in a secure way that continues to meet state rules


